Professional and attentive carers allow clients to maintain independence

SweetTree provides a range of services for people with dementia, closely matching clients with suitable carers who can best support their needs.

This could be for a minimum of three hours a day right through to 24/7 support with a live-in carer, allowing individuals to maintain their quality of life and independence in their own home. Here is Peter's story.

Peter, who is 97 and has vascular dementia, has been a SweetTree client since 2016. Originally requiring support for just a few hours a day, he now has a live-in carer, Hugo, who looks after him 24/7 at his home in West London.

During the day, Hugo assists with his care needs, washing and shopping, but he is also on hand in case Peter requires any support during the night. Peter has a detailed care plan, which is regularly discussed and updated and Hugo keeps family members updated daily with information about Peter's health, activities, nutrition and any concerns.

"Knowing that Hugo is there gives us real peace

of mind," said Peter's cousin, Richard. "They have such a terrific relationship and get on really well together. Hugo is very pro-active and they go to the local pond or for a meal together or watch TV, or he'll contact the doctor or arrange for occupational health visits.

"Hugo, who is Portuguese, is also an excellent cook and encourages Peter to eat well, even getting him to eat green vegetables, which he has always resisted!"

After Peter left school, he joined Kodak and was also in the Home Guard. He was then called up into the Navy and trained as a radar mechanic before undertaking service in Singapore.

After the war, he obtained a degree in physics, before returning to Kodak where he spent the rest of his career. He has a passion for photography and his wide network of cousins and their grown-up children love to catch up on Zoom, going through his old family and war-time photos, which help jog his memory. He regularly chats with his old friend Peggy who he met at a camera club.

Award for outstanding care

Cleo Kabanda won our annual Jairo Medina Award in 2021, which recognises an exceptional support worker. The family of the client she supported for 15 months could not praise her highly enough:

"Cleo entered our lives at the beginning of Covid, such a difficult stressful time, and she almost instantly formed a relationship with my aunt when no one else was able to do this.



"Peter is still mobile, although needs a wheelchair outdoors, and is able to live as independently as possible in his own home, the one he grew up in as a child," said Richard. "It's so much better than going into a care home as he is familiar with everything around him, which is important for people with dementia."

He added: "SweetTree have been very good at responding to Peter's requirements. We originally went to a different provider, but they weren't satisfactory. When Hugo has time off, SweetTree ensures that a replacement is provided.

"It really is fantastic to have their support. We couldn't do this ourselves. We are very lucky that Peter and Hugo get on so well together, joke together and that there is trust and companionship."

"I knew straight away that Cleo was an incredibly special person. She overflowed with care and kindness – and she had all those other wonderful qualities of professionalism and reliability...but every single thing she did was done with unconditional care and kindness for my aunt, and support and reassurance for me.

"She became like a member of our family... Cleo looked after my aunt through physical illness, worsening dementia, and challenging behaviour."

"She enabled my aunt to stay in her own home for a lot longer than would have been the case without her and that is something I will never forget."

Our fees

We understand the importance of having a clear idea of your care costs and what you are paying for. With SweetTree, you can rest assured there are no hidden fees.

Our fees include every part of the SweetTree service, from the ongoing accredited training that our support workers receive, to the oversight and expert-led management of every care package.

We have a banding system with costs dependent on the level of care required, and we will provide an accurate cost after we have carried out a specialist free assessment of your needs. We may also be able to assist you to understand what funding routes, such as Attendance Allowance and NHS Continuing Healthcare, might be available to help pay for our services.

Dementia care

How quickly will my dementia progress?

This is a question for your doctor, but it is important for us to know what type of dementia has been diagnosed. We have clients who have continued with active lifestyles with our support, showing little decline over many years.

Accepting the need for support can be emotionally challenging but having a care package can prevent a crisis point occurring. We approach dementia positively, supporting people to continue to live really well.

Our care team are trained in individual cognitive stimulation therapy (iCST), enabling them to provide meaningful, stimulating activities.

As my condition progresses, will I need to move to a care home?

Many people believe this is the only option as dementia progresses but, with the expertise of the SweetTree team, the vast majority of our clients are able to remain and live well at home.

At SweetTree, we treat each person as an individual and focus on supporting them to use the skills they have and to maintain their emotional wellbeing. Engagement and stimulation can help to slow symptoms and we work creatively with the individual and their family to support them to live a fulfilled life.

We work with many other professionals in the community such as district nursing teams, dieticians and consultants to ensure our client's wellbeing and can increase the amount of care we provide as the condition progresses, right up to a 24/7 live-in carer.

What will my care cost?

Costs depend on the individual's needs, and we will carry out a full assessment free-of-charge, but a live-in carer generally costs less than residential care. There are local authority and NHS funding sources available that our team can explore with you.
